IS THAT A FACT?

Why Whiffletree?

A "whiffletree" is a term for "the pivoted swinging bar to which the traces of a harness are fastened and by which a vehicle or implement is drawn." But, why the funny name? The bar in question was originally called a "whippletree," according to Webster, but by 1828 had taken on its new spelling.

"Whiffle," on the other hand, probably came from the word "whiff," which was in use in 1568 to denote something being "of the wind," such as blowing unsteadily. By 1591 "whiff" was used as "a quick puff or slight gust." Horses, when harnessed to a lead wagon, could be said to "whiffle" (blow unsteadily, or in gusts) as they breathed hard.

As of 1539, people were using the term "whiffler" to mean "one that clears the way for a procession," and by 1607 to mean "one that frequently changes his opinion or course. A natural secondary meaning came to be "one that uses shifts and evasions in argument." Anything that moves in this fashion, might be said to "vacillate" (from the Latin vacillatus, to sway or waver).

The way in which the whipplebar swayed and wavered on its pivot must have caused it to pick up the different pronunciation and spelling as "whifflebar."

Ah, but you ask, where did the word "whipple" originate in the first place. Well, because of the reins, traces and harness, and the way the bar moved around, it must have reminded people of a "whip roll," which, in a loom, is a "bar which supports the warp at a point between the beam and the harness." And that's a fact.


