Board Adopts New Rider Incentive Policy

The Board of Directors decided to adopt a policy that any rider who brings a new rider to an Apache Raiders show can ride free for that day. If that rider joins the club and rides that day, then the sponsor can ride every event that the new member rides free. The new rider must be someone who has never ridden before at an Apache Raiders show.

The Apache Raiders hope that the club can not only increase its membership with this policy, but also reward those members who involve themselves in making that increase a reality. A club cannot survive without a certain number of riders to cover the arena rental, ribbons, and especially the equipment. This policy gives all members, not just those on the Board, the chance to pitch in and help the Apache Raiders be the club everyone expects it to be.

So, all you members, here's your SMOKE SIGNALS challenge to start your telephone calling today to those

prospective new members who might just allow you to ride all day for free. Just think of it--bring in ten new members, ride all year for free. Hmm.....

Apache Raiders General Meeting

The Apache Raiders 1992 General meeting was held at the Arroyo Simi Equestrian Center after the last 1992 show on November 14. Gene Rinehart, Vice President called the meeting to order and appointed Richard LaValle to act as chair and Carol Young to act as secretary for the meeting.

Richard LaValle invited Ted Bowler to act as assistant chair for the meeting. Together they raised several issues for general club discussion, including attracting new riders (and members), yearend awards, show high-points, and ribbon policy.

Worth Crouch, Suzie Allard, and Kitty McClanahan provided valuable insight into the way other clubs handle these issues by presenting the Desert Riders' policies. Ideas suggested for club consideration included:

- Points awarded to all riders with prizes awarded at year end to all riders.
- Providing cash prizes for first and second places, with Chuck Wagon certificates for third place.
- Running a split arena to accommodate 60 riders--5 arena workers and 2 booth workers.
- Using the Training Run money as a Slush Fund to provide a dinner for workers.
- Low entry fees with no year-end awards.
- Higher entry fees with better year-end awards for all.
- Ways to prevent sandbagging by riders while being fair to all riders.
- Desert Riders give plaques and free meals and sodas to show workers.
- Desert Riders award \$60.00 jackets to each rider as year-end awards.

It was proposed by Richard LaValle, seconded by Worth Crouch, and voted unanimously by the members that some sort of Gift Certificate Credit for work-

ers be worked out by the Board of Directors.

Ted Bowler proposed using a new source for Event Ribbons where comparable ribbons would be ordered costing \$.87 versus the current fee of \$1.30 each. The motion was seconded and voted in.

Worth Crouch proposed and Suzie Allard seconded a new ribbon policy whereby a rider who moves up in an event competes with other riders in that move-up category for ribbons for that event only. The members voted unanimously to accept this new ribbon policy.

It was moved and seconded that event run times should be submitted to *The World of Gymkhana* by the Secretary. The motion passed unanimously.

Suzie Allard moved that Day High-Point Awards (for Horse and Pony)



should be minimal, with better Year-End Awards. Worth Crouch amended the motion to state that the Day High-Point awards would consist of a ribbon and one (1) free ride. The members voted unanimously to accept this amended motion.

It was decided by a unanimous vote that rather than having the general membership deciding the remaining issues, that the new Board of Directors should work out the details to keep the club in line with other clubs.

Elections for the 1993 Apache Raiders Board of Directors were held. For the position of District Chairman (President) Kitty McClanahan nomi-

nated Richard LaValle. The nomination was seconded by Suzie Allard. Richard was elected unanimously and is responsible for the Apache Raiders following CGA State rules. Assistant District Chairman (Vice President) Carol Young nominated Kitty McClanahan. This nomination was seconded by Richard LaValle. Kitty was elected unanimously to assist Richard in the running of the club. Richard LaValle nominated and Suzie Allard seconded the nomination for Scott Pond in a second term as Treasurer. Again the Apache Raiders voted unanimously for Scott to assume the responsibility for the finances. For Secretary, Carol Young and Sue LaValle were each nominated, but declined to run due to lack of time to devote to the job. Gene Rinehart nominated Suzie Allard. nomination was seconded by Dick Oakes and Suzie was voted in unanimously as club Secretary. LaValle nominated and Dick Oakes seconded Ted Bowler for the position of Horse Show Chairman (Show Manager). Voted in unanimously, Ted will be responsible for all show day activities and disputes. A new position of State Board Representative was created. Dick Oakes nominated and Gene Rinehart seconded the nomination of Worth Crouch to this new position. Worth, who was unanimously elected, will attend State Conventions and Meetings as the spokesperson of the Apache Raiders. Again this year two Membersat-Large positions were available for election. One is an advisory position for a Rider and one is a General advisory position. Both Paul Konzelman and Dick Oakes were nominated for the general advisory position and declined due to lack of time. Amanda LaValle was nominated, seconded, and voted unanimously as the Rider advisor Member-at-Large. Kristy Koch was nominated, seconded, and voted in unanimously as the General advisor Memberat-Large.

Apache Raiders 1993 Awards Policy

The California Gymkhana Association (CGA) District 24 Apache Raiders have four types of awards: Event, Day High-Point, Year-End High-Point, and Top Ten Riders.

Event Awards

- All properly entered riders will qualify for event awards.
- Event awards will consist of ribbons or \$0.50 buy-backs.
- *During each show the **Apache Raiders** will recognize six classes (AAA+, AAA, AA, A, FC, and Lead Line) in both the horse and pony divisions. First-through third-place awards will be given to the top three finishers in each class/division for all regular events. However, the rider must ride within or above his/her class/division time to receive that award; i.e., a AA rider must ride at least a AA time to earn an event award.
- If a rider rides above his/her division the rider will be moved up to the appropriate class and receive an award in that class; i.e., if an A rider rides a AA time, the rider will be moved into the AA class and receive an award in that class.
- In the event of a tie, duplicate awards and day high-point credit will be given; i.e., if two riders tie for first place, two first place ribbons and one third place ribbon will be awarded.
- Class/Division times are those currently in use by State CGA.
- No awards will be given for set-ups.

Day High-Point Awards

- A rider must be a member of the Apache Raiders to qualify for this award.
- A modest Day High-Point Award will be given to the horse/rider and pony/rider combinations that earn the greatest number of points during the regular show (no points are awarded for set-ups).
- Future Champion and Lead Line entrants are not eligible for Day High-Point Awards.
- Points will be awarded as follows:



•Ties for Day High-Point Awards may be resolved in any manner agreeable to Horse Show Management and the involved riders.

Year-End High-Point and Top Ten Rider Awards

ANY RIDER, REGARDLESS OF ABILITY, CAN WIN THESE AWARDS.

- A rider must be a member of the Apache Raiders and pay an additional fee of \$25.00 to be eligible for these awards.
- A Year-End High-Point Buckle will be awarded to every rider who signs up for this program and rides at least 35 regular events at Apache Raiders shows during the show season.
- A Top Ten Award will be presented to ten riders with the greatest number of year-end points at the close of the show season.
- The show season begins with the first show run during calendar year 1993 and ends with the last show run during calendar year 1993.
- Year-end high points will be accumulated as follows: One point will be awarded for each regular event run regardless of the rider's time or division. Two additional points will be awarded to each rider who competes in all regular events during a given show. For example, if there are seven regular events and a rider competes in six of them, the rider will be awarded six points; if the rider competes in all seven regular events, however, the rider will be awarded nine points (seven points for the events and two additional points).
- Points will be awarded based on the individual rider's achievements, not the horse/rider combination.

- Makes the member an "owner" of the Apache Raiders organization as well as all of its assets.

- Entitles the member to free barbeques or other refreshments provided by the Apache Raiders as finances permit.

Year-End and Top Ten Riders Awards Program Fee

Individual \$ 25.00

- Guarantees the rider a Year-End High-Point Award Buckle so long as the rider competes in at least 35 Apache Raiders regular events during the show year.
- Qualifies the rider for the Apache Raiders Year-End Top Rider awards. (Top Rider Awards will be presented to the ten riders accumulating the largest number of points during the regular show season.) Points are awarded based on the individual rider's achievements not the horse/rider combination.
- Points may be accumulated as follows:
- 1. One point for each regular event completed.
- 2. Two additional points if the rider competes in every regular event that day.

Cowpuncher Stew

Looking for some great recipes from throughout the West? Then pick up a copy of the Trail Boss's Cowboy Cookbook published by the Society for Range Management (SRM), which was founded in 1948 as a non-profit corporation dedicated to a more comprehensive understanding of the rangelands and the use of their ecosystems. Here is one example, a Historic Traildrive Recipe. found among nearly 300 pages lip-smacking ideas:

COWPUNCHER STEW

1-1/2 lbs. beef stew meat, cut in 1-inch cubes

2 tbsp. all-purpose flour

2 tsp. salt

2 tbsp. shortening

1 1/2 c. strong coffee

2 tbsp. molasses

1 clove garlic, minced

1/8 tsp. cayenne pepper

1-3/4 c. water

1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

1/2 tsp dried oregeno, crushed

4 carrots, cut in 1/2-inch slices

2 small onions, quartered

3 medium potatoes, peeled and cut up


3 tbsp. all-purpose flour

Coat beef cubes with a mixture of 2 tablespoons flour and 1 tsp. salt. In Dutch oven brown meat on all sides in hot shortening. Stir in the coffee, molasses. garlic, 1 tsp. Worcestershire, oregano, and cayenne. Cover; simmer over low heat till meat is almost tender, about 1-1/2 hours. Add 1-1/2 cups water, carrot slices, onion quarters, and potato pieces. Simmer, covered, till vegetables are tender, about 30 minutes. Blend 1/4 cup cold water into the 3 tbsp. flour; add to stew mixture. Cook and stir till the mixture is thickened and bubbly. Serve in bowls. Makes 6 to 8 servings.
