## Trail Writing with Hondo





Looking forward to a great time next Christmas.






#### Unannounced



We now have a new president and vice president, and they surely will need our prayers and support.





## More Time for Movies and Serials




#### ANNOUNCED!

- 12/30 No meeting held because of the end-of-year holidays.








# Heard at December's Meetings

Words fail me, Durango! Tirst the chuck wagon and then your hand-crafted statue of Hoppy. You're a wonder! Thanks good buddy. - Buck




# December Tip of the White Hat


This month's "Tip of the White Hat" goes out to Durango for all the time, talent, and friendship that went into every chuck wagon he made for his fellow Trail Tiders.
